**DMV Notice Regarding Non-Domiciled CDLs  
and Driver's Licenses Holders**

Today, the California **Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV)** will send notifications to approximately **15,000 non-domiciled Commercial Driver's License (CDL) holders**, informing them that their CDLs **will no longer be valid after 60 days and will be revoked.**

**Revocation Based on Expiration of Immigration Documents:**

A non-domiciled CDL will be revoked **after 60 days** if its expiration date extends beyond the expiration date of the holder's immigration documents, or if those immigration documents have already expired.

Under the Interim Final Rule (IFR), the expiration date on a non-domiciled CDL must be set to expire **before** the expiration date of the CDL holder's immigration documents.

**Reissuance for Valid Immigration Documents:**

If a non-domiciled CDL holder has valid immigration documents (such as an unexpired I-94 and an H2-A, H2-B, or E-2 visa), the **DMV can reissue a new CDL that complies with the Interim Final Rule (IFR) requirements.**

Please note, the IFR explicitly excludes asylees, asylum seekers, refugees, and DACA recipients from obtaining and renewing a non-domiciled CDL.

**Potential Revocation of Basic Driver's License:**

In addition to the revocation of the CDL, non-domiciled CDL holders may also have their **basic driver's license** revoked if they do not meet the new eligibility requirements of the IFR. These individuals may be able to apply for a noncommercial driver's license by visiting a DMV office.
